NYCC STREET MINISTRY.....FALLING OFF WAGONS

After getting the most amazing helpers putting the lunches together, grabbing a bag of socks, loading the car, Caroline and I were off to Portland. Priscilla had asked to go with us as had one of Caroline's school friends, Erin. We did not know where we would find folks today, but it didn't take long once we got to the city, especially near Preble Street and Elena's Way. Once parked Caroline, Erin and Priscilla took off with the lunches, and I grabbed the bag of socks. As I walked along folks were helping themselves to a pair or two, very polite and appreciative. As I continued down the street a middle aged man was coming toward me. I offered him the socks and his response was, "I am so sick". Needless to say I was very concerned, especially not knowing why he was sick. He did not look good at all. I backed up a little.....just in case. I asked him what was wrong; he kind of fumbled an explanation, finally just admitting to me that he had fallen off the wagon last night. In my day this meant alcohol. Eventually he admitted that it wasn't alcohol.....he had not had anything to drink in a long time. It was drugs AND then he proceeded to list several drugs.

I need to admit that I know next to nothing about today's drug culture, but was shocked that he could name so many ...I'll call them street drugs. We kind of awkwardly stood there for a moment, when I finally quietly said, "I can't give you money for drugs" and you know what his response was? Very politely and softly " Thank you". I 've thought a lot about him the last few days.

On the way home someone commented about the "hugeness" of the homeless problem There was a long silence and finally Caroline spoke, "We have just given out 24 tasty lunches and a some dry clean socks. That feels right."

The problem is indeed huge. In my opinion the drug situation is a major factor, if not THE major problem, If drugs were taken out of the equation. I wonder what would be left.

We are incredibly thankful that NYCC is so supportive of this ministry. Because of you, on Sunday 24 folks had a lovely bag lunch and a pair or two of dry socks!


